

Student Vote 2025: Our Results Are In!

Over the past week, students across Canada—including those at **Esquimalt High School**—took part in the **Student Vote Canada 2025**, a parallel election that encourages civic learning and hands-on experience with the democratic process.

We're proud of our students for taking the time to learn about political parties, explore the issues that matter to them, and cast an informed ballot. This experience helps build the foundation for confident, engaged citizens.

Here are the national results as decided by students:

- Conservative Party 165 seats (36.4%)
- Liberal Party 145 seats (31.7%)
- Bloc Québécois 18 seats (2.1%)
- NDP 13 seats (14.5%)
- **Green Party** 2 seats (7.5%)

The students elected a Conservative minority government, with the Liberal Party forming the official opposition. This result presents a different picture from the actual federal election, where the Liberals won 168 seats—just shy of the 172 needed for a majority. This contrast highlights the importance of participating in elections and engaging in our democracy.

Vaccination update 💋

Immunization Program is looking to update the information about public health and respond during an outbreak, under the Vaccination Status Reporting Regulation (VSRR). For that reason, Island Health is mailing letters to households of students whom immunization records are missing or incomplete. If you receive a letter, please update your child's records directly through the online Provincial Immunization Record Registry or drop your records at your local public unit health.

If your child's records are up to date, you won't be contacted and don't need to update the information.



Supporting Our Students: Food Programs at Esquimalt

Our **Breakfast and Lunch Programs** are here to support those facing financial hardship, ensuring they have access to nourishing meals. If your family can provide meals from home, we kindly ask that you leave these programs available for those who need them most. That said, we understand that sometimes a student might need a little extra support, and we're here for those moments too.

For everyone in our school community, the Rainbow Kitchen "Fridge of Love" is always open! Students and staff are welcome to grab a snack—no questions asked, just kindness shared.

Student and Family Affordability Fund

In March 2024, the Ministry of Education and Child Care provided districts with one-time **Student and Family Affordability Funds (SFAF)** to help families struggling with school-related costs. These funds offer **temporary**, **flexible**, **and private** assistance for school supplies and fees, ensuring support without stigma.

Funding use includes, but is not limited to:

1. Goods:

- Providing basic school supplies that might otherwise be purchased by parents, guardians, and students (e.g., pens, paper); and
- Supporting with clothing/footwear required for school sports or other school activities.

2. Fees:

- Waiving education-related fees (e.g., additional supplies for shop, culinary and craft classes, workbooks, camps, field trips, relevant cultural events, other student society meetings including those related to equity, diversity, and inclusion, and instrument and equipment fees or other fees charged by school districts); and
- Fees for school sports and other school activities.






