

HOW TO BROWSE A GALE VIRTUAL REFERENCE LIBRARY TITLE FROM CHAPTER TO CHAPTER

STEP ONE

Find your book on the electronic bookshelf. For this example, I'm using *Environmental Science: In Context*.



STEP TWO

Select the chapter you'd like to start with.
