### RibFest - The most success yet!!

On September 6, 7 and 8 over 45,000 people attend the seventh annual Esquimalt RibFest at Bullen Park. This year's attendees were treated to music from 21 bands, 6 large rib companies, 8 local brewers and 22 community vendors at this family friendly event. As well, this year people were welcomed at the entrance by an eighteenfoot inflatable mascot courtesy of Black Ball Ferries and could enjoy their food under the protection of a 5,000 square foot tent. Through the tremendous generosity of those people attending RibFest, the Esquimalt Fire Fighters' Charitable Foundation received just over



\$50,000 in donations at the front gate. These funds will be directed to many local groups serving Esquimalt. Over the 7 years of RibFest the Charitable Foundation has returned close to a quarter of a million dollars to groups working for Esquimalt residents.



As well, at this year's event several Esquimalt High School teams and groups raised about \$12,000 for school and community activities. The Robotics Team earned \$1,500 by running the bubble soccer activity and the Girls Basketball Teams received \$1,000 by assisting with the supervision of the play area in the Kids' Zone. The Athletic Program sold their raffle tickets for – 'A trip for two anywhere West Jet flies' and

raised close to \$2,500 on the Friday and Saturday. Lastly, the

Esquimalt Alumni Association and Esquimalt Leadership Class again ran the Langos Booth along with the Rainbow Kitchen volunteers. Each of these groups had about a dozen volunteers that worked at the booth and shared in just over \$6,600 profit from selling 1,100 langos (beaver tails) along with pop and water during



the weekend. The Alumni




Association also sold \$500 worth of Esquimalt High tshirts and scarves over the 3 days. The support from the community continues to be outstanding as each of these groups has shared in close to \$45,000 over the 7 years of RibFest. The Alumni Executive would like to say a big thank you to all the people attending RibFest for the generosity that they have provided to the groups raising funds for each of their endeavors. Also, a special thank you to the many volunteers that make the Langos Booth and the overall event happen!! Please mark your calendar for next year's event September 11, 12 and 13 2020.



#### **Turf Field Update**

We have had no word yet, on the status of the grant application to the Community, Cultural and Recreation Program that was submitted at the end of January 2019. The CCR Program is a joint Federal and Provincial Government initiative. The grant application was for a new turf field at Esquimalt High School in the amount of \$3.1 million. It was a joint effort with the Songhees First Nations, the Municipality of Esquimalt, the Greater Victoria School Board, the Esquimalt RibFest Society and the EHS Alumni Association. The school-based portion for this endeavor



was generously increased by the Esquimalt RibFest Society this fall in the amount of \$68,000, to bring the total held at the school to now just over \$261,000. We are hopeful to hear soon about the disposition of the grant application.

#### School Update

As presented by Tina Pierek, new principal of the school after two months on the job. This report was given to the Alumni Executive at their regularly scheduled metting in October:

• EHS students and staff were involved with RibFest.

- Staffing has been increased as the numbers were higher than anticipated. There are 715 local students, plus 100 international students.
- The Grade 9 Meet the Teacher night and the Parent-Teacher Interview night have both taken place.
- The school planned two consecutive Pro D Days to allow for a facilitator to conduct some visioning work. This included examining the history of the school, and considering the school's strengths and obstacles. The outcome was a set of goals for the next four years.
- "Orange Shirt" day was a success.
- A monthly collaboration schedule has been established, allowing committees to meet once a month on an early dismissal Wednesday afternoon.
- Interim reports are going out, and the stress is rising, especially among the high achieving 4C Challenge students.
- Counsellors are conducting stress management sessions with the grade 12 students.
- EHS has applied to host a conference on mental health in May. It is a timely topic, but will be a lot of work for the school if they are awarded the conference.
- Several initiatives are underway to promote a stronger relationship between members (parents) of both the Songhees Band and the Esquimalt Nation Band, and the high school. Next month's PAC meeting will be held at the Songhees Wellness Centre, and a meeting in the spring will be held at the Esquimalt Nation Band Office.
- EHS staff are using the math and literacy level programs offered through Link as a way to offer individualized Math 9 components to Math 10 students who have some gaps from the previous year. This plan allows them to remain in Math 10.

Also, you will have the opportunity to meet Tina Pierek, the new principal of Esquimalt High School and ask any questions at the AGM.

#### **Privacy Policy & Policy for Records Retention & Access**

The Policy for Protection of Privacy governs how both the Esquimalt High School Alumni Association and the Alumni Foundation collect, use, disclose and safeguard personal information. The Policy for Records Retention and Access establishes a procedure by which an applicant can request access to the records of the association or the foundation.

Thanks to the leadership of Alumni and Foundation director, George Copley, both policies have been updated in line with the new Societies Act.

#### **Esquimalt High School PAC Raffle**

Thank you to all that entered the raffle that was put on by the Esquimalt High School PAC and supporting the Athletics Department. In total, roughly 1,600 tickets were sold which brought



in about \$7,500 for the Athletics Department. The prize was 2 return tickets anywhere in the world where WestJet flies. The winner was John Lacriox, a former student of Esquimalt High. When asked where he would be traveling to his response was, "The wife has already chosen where we are going."
