Grant proposal for New Turf Field

The project is now called the "Es-Whoy-Malth Community Field Collaborative". For those that weren't born and raised in Esquimalt, 'Es-Whoy-Malth' is Lekwungen for 'Place of Shoaling Waters'. This is perfect for our project as the EHS Field is built over a creek (now underground) that shoals from Vic West through Esquimalt into the Gorge.

A group of community-minded people have worked diligently on a grant application since January 2019 to meet the deadline of January 25, 2019 for a large fund called the CCR Program. This is the Community, Cultural and Recreation Program and the collaborative efforts have produced a pretty compelling package.


The main part of the grant team includes The Songhees First Nation as the signatory, the Township of Esquimalt and School District #61 who all have various roles outlined in a Memorandum of Understanding. Ribfest, numerous sporting groups, the EHS Alumni Association and many other organizations are the 'supporting cast' and have provided letters and/or endorsements, as well as a guarantee of \$320,000 in cash support of which \$191,500 is from Ribfest!

This project is divided into three phases: the first phase being the new turf field and lighting system. Under the guidance and counsel of some Recreation people and grant experts, we are asking for \$3.31M for this phase with a projected start date of later this year. The focus has been on quality, not cutting corners and ensuring everything we do is high end, state of the art and built with the latest technologies. The next two phases are:

- A community track/chip trail and revitalization (raise, re-surface, install drainage, etc) of the lower EHS field, keeping it grass; and
- A multi-purpose cultural centre and field house which includes a student gym, music area, change rooms, stands, viewing area and washrooms.

We have fingers crossed for a thumb's up response and hope to hear something back before the end of June. The funds raised from the Esquimalt RibFest have allowed us to proceed with this grant application. Thank you to all who have helped at RibFest and all of those who have attended this annual event. Here is a sample of the expected layout of the project.

EHS Robotics Team:

One of our goals in the year is to be able to do outreach to our family of schools. This year part of our team was able to bring Spike over to Rockheights Middle School and share our enthusiasm for robotics with the grade 8 class.

Our group participated in the Island Farms Victoria Day parade and had a tent in the square afterwards where we allowed children to come and drive our robot (with some help).

At the end of our first year, we were able to attend the World Championships in Houston Texas. Twelve students and 2 parents joined us for a whirlwind week with 400+ teams from all over the world. Our students were challenged to go beyond what they knew and saw what they had the possibility of doing with the other veteran teams (some of them had been going for 20+ years).



Recap of this year:

Our 2018-2019 season has been a year of learning, patience and tons of work. We grew from a team of 12 to a team of 22.

Organization was a key component this year: we attempted to divide our team into subteams of business, building/design, 3D printing, driving and programming. This proved to not be the best idea for team building and next year we will return to our original model of all members participating, especially the building and design.

Kauphs

We continued to produce our own 3D printed parts designed in Fusion 360 and printed on our school 3D printers. The design aspect has grown for our team and the skills that the students are learning will carry them well into this technical field.

There are times where everything that will go wrong does - the Canadian Pacific Regionals was our example of that in March 2019. Our robot limped through every match, wires coming undone, issues with design and construction - but - true to Atom Smasher's (Esquimalt) spirit our team faced every obstacle with a huge smile and a get down to work attitude. Our competition is now complete and we are working on the next step of community involvement and fundraising for next season.

We appreciate all the support we have had through various businesses and organizations as we walk down this road of learning. This has definitely been our learning year and we are eager to utilize our lessons in productive ways to help us grow as individuals and as a team.

Scholarship Update:

Seven awards were presented to 2018 Esquimalt graduates. Two awards were from the EHS Class of 1968, three awards were fund-raised by the Alumni Association, and two awards are from organizations that have disbanded, but left the funds in the safe-keeping of the Alumni Association.

Susan Tomlinson (grad of 1968) presented the Class of 1968 awards to Marin Hoh and Saskia van Beers. Marin is an all-round amazing student, committing countless hours to ESCAPE, EYCI and Rotary Clubs, at the same time playing the cello in the Victoria Conservatory of Music's Young Artists Collegium Program. She plans to attend McGill or Concordia in 2019.

Saskia was involved in twelve different clubs and volunteer roles in her senior years, and also had two major weekly volunteer commitments outside of school. The common thread with her extra-curricular activities is a belief in helping others and making her community better. She is currently in first year of Engineering Science at the University of Toronto.

The three Esquimalt Alumni Association Scholarships are given to students who made a positive impact on the school community while demonstrating commitment to their studies. This year's winners were Meghan Scott, Magritte Gordaneer and Aya Ezzedine.

Meghan is a true leader. She was one of the two 2018 valedictorians and was elected grade 12 rep for the Challenge program. She has committed endless hours to multiple social justice clubs and leadership classes at EHS. She was involved in ESCAPE, EYCI, Rotary's Interact Club, and Model UN. She is currently studying in the Integrative Science program at University of Western Ontario.

Magritte was the co-founder of Esquimalt's Youth Political Commons group, and was instrumental in seeing four other chapters established in other Victoria high schools. This young activist is described as wise beyond her years. She has participated in the B.C. Youth Parliament, was a head delegate for Model UN activities, was Policy Co-chair of the Victoria Climate Hub and was an organizer for the March for Our Lives Rally in 2018. Magritte is currently attending McGill University as a student in their Political Science Department.

Aya came to Canada as a nine-year-old from Lebanon. Overcoming obstacles has become a theme with this young woman. She has not only learned English very well, but she has become a passionate writer. In spite of significant health challenges that nearly took her out of school, she worked on the yearbook, volunteered as a Lebanese cuisine chef, and created multiple graphics for school events. She is presently studying at Sprott-Shaw College and plans to enter the field of psychology in the future.

The Esquimalt Writers' Group Award was presented to Lia Rozenbloom Holla. Although she is pursuing a degree in biochemistry and international relations, Lia has a passion for English and English Literature, and is a highly skilled singer and actor. She is also committed to helping others, locally and globally, whether it was collecting shoes for hurricane victims, organizing disarmament and March for Our Lives rallies, working for HDNA Youth summer camps or cofounding the Youth Political Commons.

The Esquimalt Kiwanis Club Scholarship, given to a community minded student who is pursuing studies in the Fine Arts, was presented to Josephine Thompson. Josephine is both an outstanding science student and a student of music, and has won multiple awards for both piano and violin. She will be auditioning for McGill University's symphony orchestra in her first year of Life Sciences, with a minor in Music. Josephine also committed countless hours with ESCAPE, EYCl and Rotary Clubs, and mentored younger musicians.
