Scholarships / Awards

The Rotary Club of Victoria is committed to making a difference for youth. One of the ways we do this is to support graduating students who will be attending a post-secondary institution in the fall and other high school students who exemplify the values of Rotary.

We seek to reward students who make a positive difference in our community and show that they can become our future leaders. Each year we award scholarships at Esquimalt High School, and the additional scholarships/awards will be available to graduating students throughout Greater Victoria. The values of the awards will be either \$1500 or \$2000.

To qualify, you:

- must be enrolled at a public secondary school in School District 61 (Greater Victoria), School District 62 (Sooke), School District 63 (Saanich), at a secondary school in School District 93 (French first-language) located within the geographical limits of District 61, 62 or 63) or other secondary school within the geographical boundaries of District 61, 62 or 63;
- must be graduating in June this year for a scholarship and continuing your education at a recognized post-secondary institution in the fall. Generally, the possibility of a gap year is not allowed; however, a request to start classes in January following graduation will be considered.

To apply, please download the preferred application form (<u>English version</u>) or (<u>French version</u>) and complete it. The form is a Microsoft Excel spreadsheet and can be printed after you fill it in or attached directly to the emailed complete scholarship request.

Attach the completed form (excel or PDF), your resumé, official transcript of marks and a copy of your acceptance letter from a post-secondary institution and email them to the scholarship committee at <u>rcv.scholarships@rotaryvictoria.ca</u>. Contact two (2) references and have them send letters to the same email address.

The deadline for applications is June 30 each year.

Once we receive your application, if we have questions, we will contact you and we may ask you to meet with us.

We will announce the recipients by August 31 each year.

Esquimalt High Scholarships and Bursaries

- A variety of scholarships and bursaries for students graduating from Esquimalt.
- It is a "one-application" process-- in other words, one application can be used for multiple awards. Gap year is OK for most (not the Lions Club).
- The application itself has **TWO PARTS**: paper submission and digital submission. Both parts must be completed to be considered for these awards.
- Due June 23.
- To view the list of awards, <u>click here</u>. There are NEW awards being added this week, however. Mrs. Bjornson will make announcements on the Google Classroom when the new awards are added.
- Applications are found on the Scholarship & Postsecondary Google Classroom.

District 61 Scholarships and Bursaries

- A list of scholarships and bursaries are available through District 61.
- Please access a <u>summarized list here</u>.
- This application can be submitted through the Scholarship 12 Google Classroom OR it can be handed to Mrs. Bjornson before the June 21, 2022 deadline.
- If multiple scholarships are being applied for, only one copy of the reference letter and scholarship letter is required. Each scholarship needs its own signed application, however.

- Note: One award is designated for Esquimalt High students above all other high schools in the district. If you know someone entering the field of FIRE FIGHTING, let them know there is a \$1000 scholarship for them to apply for!
- Note: The Stephanie Johnston Doney Scholarship (for field hockey) closes **June 10, 2022**. Please send Mrs. Bjornson your application right away if you are eligible. The Stephanie Johnston Doney Foundation will review and select the winner.

Scholarships and Bursaries Spreadsheet and Student Loans

- Please <u>cruise this spreadsheet</u> for further opportunities that have not been highlighted in The Docker. Mrs. Bjornson continually adds to this spreadsheet throughout the year.
- Should a link not work, Google the name of the award to see if it still exists.
- Deadlines are not posted since dates change from year to year. The general deadlines are grouped together in tabs along the bottom of the spreadsheet.
- All 2022 Graduates are encouraged to apply for scholarships through the summer and even into the Fall. **If a student receives a student loan**, it automatically makes them eligible for bursaries that are distributed through their new school.
- **Student loans** can be applied for through <u>Student Aid BC</u>. This application process needs to be started in the summer. Once the loan is confirmed, start applying for bursaries through the new school.
