October recipe Pumpkin Shaped Pumpkin Bread

Ingredients

1 cup warm water

2 tsp yeast

1 tsp salt

3 1/2 cups flour

¼ cup granulated sugar

¼ butter

1 egg

¾ cup pumpkin puree

Pretzel sticks

1/2 cup melted chocolate

2 tbsp olive oil

Equipment

Baking twine





INSTRUCTIONS

Stir water, yeast, and 1 tsp sugar together in a small bowl. Leave for 5-10 minutes until risen. Add the rest of the sugar, butter, egg, and pumpkin to a separate, bigger bowl and mix. Then add the yeast mixture to the pumpkin mixture and mix. When combined slowly add the flour and salt. Mix until it starts to come together and then start kneading it on a floured surface until smooth. Put in a greased bowl and cover until doubled in size (about 1-2 hours). While it is rising take your twine and cut it into 5-inch pieces. Toss in a bowl with olive oil and set aside. After the dough has risen cut it into the size you want (I suggest golf ball size). Then take your twine pieces and tie them around the dough balls until it looks like a pumpkin. Don't tie too tight as they will rise. Leave to rise for 30 minutes and while they rise preheat the oven to 350 F. Bake for about 15 minutes or until golden brown. After they cool enough to tough them cut and remove the string. Melt the chocolate and dip the pretzels into the chocolate and add them to the tops of the pumpkins. enjoy!

Halloween history

Nearly everyone knows what Halloween is: kids go trick or treating, teens and adults go to parties, and new scary movies come out. This celebration and its variations are wildly popular around the world. Halloween, also known as All Hallows' Eve, is an annual holiday celebrated on October 31st. The holiday started with a Celtic festival called Samhain, during which people wore costumes and lit bonfires to ward off evil spirits. They did this because their new year was November 1st, and it marked the day summer and harvest ended. Since it was so dark and cold during this time of year it was associated with death. So on the day before they believed that the ghosts came back to earth as the border between living and death blurred.



They believed the Spirits damaged their crops and made it easier for their priests to receive prophecies. Then in the 8th century, Pope Gregory the third announced that November 1st was a day to honor all of the catholic saints and martyrs called "all saints day" and around 1000 AD the church created a day to honor the dead called "All Souls Day," by the 9th century **Christianity had spread to Celtic lands** and began to blend with the original traditions, eventually completely replacing them but leaving elements of how the previous tradition was celebrated.

Smile is a psychological horror movie that was made this year, it's rated R. Here's a review from one of our writers:



SPOOKY/MAGICAL BOOK CORNER




