UPDATE - Student and Family Affordability Fund:

As you may be aware, the Greater Victoria School District has received \$1.9 million in one-time funding from the Ministry of Education and Child Care to assist families temporarily facing financial challenges associated with going back to school. The <u>Student and Family Affordability Fund</u> has been created to improve food security and assist parents, guardians, and students with school-associated costs, such as school supplies and education-related fees. The funds will be provided in as flexible, private and stigma-free manner as possible. **All schools have since been provided with limited funds to help support the following:**

- Nutritional food/meals, before, during and after the school day (Grocery gift cards, cafeteria cards)
- Basic goods required for learning such as school supplies and clothing/footwear for school sports/activities
- Fees for school sports and other school activities (E.g., Grad events)
- Transportation support (E.g., gas cards, bus tickets, but passes)
- To help off-set costs for families already facing challenges utilizing existing support systems in place

Child Care Studio and Volleyball Court Community Consultation

Proposed Child Care Buildings and Parking Location

In 2018, the Greater Victoria School District (GVSD) applied to the Ministry of Children and Family Development to create new child care spaces on a number of Greater Victoria School District properties. The GVSD was successful in all their applications and received funding for a number of elementary school locations—Frank Hobbs, Dongaster, Macaulay, Victoria West, and Tillicum, to name a few. The Greater Victoria School District has applied for further child care funding and was approved for two exclusive child care units at the Esquimalt Secondary school site.

The child care units are built by GVSD employees, with two dry units attached to one wet unit that includes six bathrooms, storage, and a full kitchen as per the licensing requirements. The child care units will be licensed with one unit offering full-time infant/toddler care and the other unit licensed for full time care for children ages 3-5 years old. The child care area will have a dedicated fenced area for participants with dedicated parking spots for child care staff within the current lot and dedicated drop off / pick up parking for child care families.


There are five proposed volleyball courts within the site plan that will be enclosed with fencing for school and community use.

The courts will be built and maintained by a third party with student use during school hours and community use outside regular school hours.

All child care spots will be open to the Esquimalt Secondary school population first and the community second. The child care units will allow the students at Esquimalt Secondary to obtain practicum hours in a child care setting for graduation requirements. The GVSD is still in the process of finalizing child care providers for the approved sites and will not be taking waitlist applications. The GVSD has started to consult on the proposed location for the child care units by meeting with school community members. The GVSD is wanting to extend consultation to the surrounding community. Appendix A – Conceptual Design Layout for Child Care Units



Dear Parents/Guardians,

On Tuesday November 30th, at approximately 1:00 pm, Esquimalt High will be conducting a lockdown drill.

Lockdowns occur when there is a perceived threat to the safety of students or staff, usually by an intruder who has or is thought to have a weapon. Our Superintendent has requested that all schools in the district conduct a lockdown drill each year.

We are currently going through a process to prepare for this drill. Teachers will be informing students and answering any questions they may have about the drill and lockdown procedures. Administrators are also available to answer questions.

The drill will last approximately one hour. An administrator will come on the P.A. system and say,
"Attention, this is Mr./Mrs. ______ speaking. This is a lockdown drill. I repeat, this is just a drill.
Lockdown."

At this time, teachers will go to their doors, check hallways for students and if necessary direct them inside. Doors will be closed and locked, window blinds closed and students will be instructed to remain quiet, out of sight and off electronic devices. The expectation is that students take the drill as seriously as they would a fire or earthquake drill.

If during the drill, students find themselves in a hallway, they are to go quickly to the nearest washroom. If in the washroom, they should remain there, shut the door and lock it if possible, then get in a cubicle and raise their feet. Students in the gym area will be instructed by a teacher to go to an equipment storage room, the weight room, or a change room. For the purposes of the drill, any students outside, such as a PE class will assemble at the far end of the field.

The administration and officers from the Victoria Police Department will spend 30-45 minutes inspecting the halls and grounds to assess the lockdown response. Administration and police officers will go door to door to end the lockdown drill.

DUAL CREDIT COURSES IN COMMUNITY, FAMILY & CHILD STUDIES

Course Option One: Online Delivery

Health 111 - Indigenous Peoples Health

Students will explore indigenous peoples' health experiences: past, present, and future. Using a strength-based and holistic perspective, students will learn about the current realities of Indigenous peoples' health experiences, and will be introduced to traditional healing practices. Students will be able to use this knowledge to further their own understanding of Indigenous peoples' health, and can apply this experience to work with children, families and in community.

Course Option Two: On Campus Delivery

ELC 110 - Perspectives on Child Growth Development

Students will examine and explore current and emerging theories and perspectives that explain human growth and development from conception to early childhood. Students will begin to reflect on their image of children and families through multiple lenses, including an introduction to indigenous worldviews, to broaden their thinking about children and their growth. The impact of colonization and the residential school experience is explored to support decolonization and reconciliation. Theoretical knowledge will be considered in connection to relationship building with children and families and early childhood practice.









Make research easier with more reliable information


Our school library learning commons website <u>esquimaltlibrary.sd61.bc.ca</u> includes a powerful <u>Research</u> <u>Toolkit</u> to help students find reliable information easily and quickly.

<u>The Research Toolkit</u> includes several services, such as <u>Gale's PowerSearch</u>, <u>EBSCO's Explora</u>, the <u>National Film Board</u> and <u>CBC's collections</u> as well as familiar standards such as <u>WorldBook Encyclopedia</u> and the <u>Encyclopedia</u> of <u>BC</u>. These provide:

- simple search tools that quickly deliver relevant results including articles, e-books, essays and primary source documents
- high-quality articles licensed from reputable publishers, recognized by library professionals and selected for use in a schools
- carefully curated categories to help browse popular research topics and subject areas
- topic overviews to give students a starting point for research
- powerful filters to focus results by type of source, date and reading level
- have text read aloud users choose the voice and speed
- a colourful, mobile-friendly design

Most of these services are password protected. Students can access the usernames and passwords using the link at the top of the page. Users will need to set up accounts to use NFB Campus and CBC's Curio services.
