Student and Family Affordability Fund:

As you may be aware, the Greater Victoria School District has received \$1.9 million in one-time funding from the Ministry of Education and Child Care to assist families temporarily facing financial challenges associated with going back to school. The <u>Student and Family Affordability Fund</u> has been created to improve food security and assist parents, guardians, and students with school-associated costs, such as school supplies andeducation-related fees. The funds will be provided in as flexible, private and stigma-free manner as possible. All schools have since been provided with limited funds to help support the following:

- Nutritional food/meals, before, during school day through school meal program (Grocery gift cards)
- Basic goods required for learning such as school supplies and clothing/footwear for school sports/activities
- Fees for school sports and other school activities (E.g., Grad events)
- Transportation support (E.g., gas cards, bus tickets, bus passes)
