Esquimalt High Scholarships and Bursaries

- A variety of scholarships and bursaries for students graduating from Esquimalt.
- It is a "one-application" process-- in other words, one application can be used for multiple awards. Gap year is OK for most (not the Lions Club).
- The application itself has **TWO PARTS**: paper submission and digital submission. Both parts must be completed to be considered for these awards.
- Due June 23.

- Applications are found on the Scholarship & Postsecondary Google Classroom and in Mrs. Bjornson's office, 211a.

District 61 Scholarships and Bursaries

- A list of scholarships and bursaries are available through District 61.
- Please access a <u>summarized list here</u>.
- This application can be submitted through the Scholarship 12 Google Classroom OR it can be handed to Mrs. Bjornson before the June 21, 2022 deadline.
- If multiple scholarships are being applied for, only one copy of the reference letter and scholarship letter is required. Each scholarship needs its own signed application, however.

- Note: One award is designated for Esquimalt High students above all other high schools in the district. If you know someone entering the field of FIRE FIGHTING, let them know there is a \$1000 scholarship for them to apply for!

Bjornson your application right away if you are eligible. The Stephanie Johnston Doney Foundation will review and select the winner.

Scholarships and Bursaries Spreadsheet and Student Loans

- Please <u>cruise this spreadsheet</u> for further opportunities that have not been highlighted in The Docker. Mrs. Bjornson continually adds to this spreadsheet throughout the year.
- Should a link not work, Google the name of the award to see if it still exists.
- Deadlines are not posted since dates change from year to year. The general deadlines are grouped together in tabs along the bottom of the spreadsheet.
- All 2023 Graduates are encouraged to apply for scholarships through the summer and even into the Fall. If a student receives a student loan, it automatically makes them eligible for bursaries that are distributed through their new school.
- **Student loans** can be applied for through <u>Student Aid BC.</u> This application process needs to be started in the summer. Once the loan is confirmed, start applying for bursaries through the new school.

REMINDERS:

Student and Family Affordability Fund:

As you may be aware, the Greater Victoria School District has received \$1.9 million in one-time funding from the Ministry of Education and Child Care to assist families temporarily facing financial challenges associated with going back to school. The <u>Student and Family Affordability Fund</u> has been created to improve food security and assist parents, guardians, and students with school-associated costs, such as school supplies andeducation-related fees. The funds will be provided in as flexible, private and stigma-free manner as possible. **All schools have since been provided with limited funds to help support the following:**

- Nutritional food/meals, before, during school day through school meal program (Grocery gift cards)
- Basic goods required for learning such as school supplies and clothing/footwear for school sports/activities
- Fees for school sports and other school activities (E.g., Grad events)
- Transportation support (E.g., gas cards, bus tickets, bus passes)
- To help off-set costs for families already facing challenges utilizing existing support systems in place
