Attention Students in Grade 11 and Grade 12: Catch Up Vaccinations on Feb. 21st

BC has launched a Cancer Care Action Plan to better prevent, detect, and treat cancers. As part of the prevention strategy, Island Health students in grade 11 and 12 will be offered an additional opportunity to catch up on HPV vaccination, a safe and effective way to prevent a variety of cancers.

Public Health will be providing an opportunity for grade 11 and 12 students who remain eligible for childhood & school-age immunizations (excluding COVID-19 and influenza vaccines) to be immunized at an upcoming school-based immunization clinic. A letter with more information will be sent home with Grade 11 and 12 students shortly.

Please discuss the information in this letter with your child, as students in grade 11 and 12 will be offered the opportunity to consent to or refuse immunizations on their own behalf through the mature minor consent process. Children under the age of 19, who can understand the benefits of getting immunized, possible side effects after receiving the immunization, and the risk of not getting immunized, can legally consent to getting the immunization or refuse it.

Parent Connect:

Parent Connect is an online service developed by the Greater Victoria School District to expedite consent requests and access Learning Updates (report cards). The service reduces the amount of paper forms and allows parents and school staff to review a student's consent information on-demand. The service also includes Google Translate to support parents who prefer to communicate in languages other than English.

Learning Updates (report cards) are shared digitally with both parents and students through Parent Connect and Student Connect.

<u>All Learning Updates will only be shared via Parent Connect and Student Connect.</u> Paper copies of Learning Updates will only be available upon request in person from the office.

GVSD Student Connect allows students to review privacy information and choose which online digital services they consent to use. Students should review their current consent items at the start of each school year.

New items can be added at any time (for example if a student needs access to a service in Gr. 11 that they did not need previously). Consent can also be revoked at any time if a student is misusing technology.



Reminder about taking photos and filming at Esquimalt: CONSENT is important. BEFORE taking a student or staff members' photo or filming, you must ask for permission first.

Food Programs at Esquimalt:

A reminder that our **Breakfast and Lunch programs** are intended for those students who are experiencing financial hardship/need. While we appreciate that other students may at times need to access breakfast on occasion, we are asking that those students who are able to access food at home please do so.

Student and Family Affordability Fund:

In March 2024, the Ministry of Education and Child Care provided districts with additional one-time Student and Family Affordability Funds (SFAF). The Student and Family Affordability Fund is intended to support families with costs associated with going to school that they may be struggling to pay. The aim is to make life more affordable for families who are temporarily facing financial challenges and need temporary assistance with the current cost of school supplies and educated related fees. The funds will be provided in as flexible, private and stigma-free manner as possible.

Funding use includes, but is not limited to:

1. Goods:

- Providing basic school supplies that might otherwise be purchased by parents, guardians, and students (e.g., pens, paper); and
- Supporting with clothing/footwear required for school sports or other school activities.

2. Fees:

- Waiving education-related fees (e.g., additional supplies for shop, culinary and craft classes, workbooks, camps, field trips, relevant cultural events, other student society meetings including those related to equity, diversity, and inclusion, and instrument and equipment fees or other fees charged by school districts); and
- Fees for school sports and other school activities.
