# ■Parent Connect: How to Check Report Cards online?





# **Student and Family Affordability Fund**

In March 2024, the Ministry of Education and Child Care provided districts with one-time **Student and Family Affordability Funds (SFAF)** to help families struggling with school-related costs. These funds offer **temporary**, **flexible**, **and private** assistance for school supplies and fees, ensuring support without stigma.

Funding use includes, but is not limited to:

#### 1. Goods:

- Providing basic school supplies that might otherwise be purchased by parents, guardians, and students (e.g., pens, paper); and
- Supporting with clothing/footwear required for school sports or other school activities.

#### 2. Fees:

- Waiving education-related fees (e.g., additional supplies for shop, culinary and craft classes, workbooks, camps, field trips, relevant cultural events, other student society meetings including those related to equity, diversity, and inclusion, and instrument and equipment fees or other fees charged by school districts); and
- Fees for school sports and other school activities.

### **Congratulations to Esquimalt Rec and Esquimalt High Partnership!**

The Township of Esquimalt was recognized at the 2025 BC Economic Development Awards for Esquimalt Recreation's Youth Aquatic Safety and Leadership Program.



The program was originally designed to address the lifeguard shortages during COVID-19—these shortages led to pool closures due to insufficient lifeguard numbers.

To make certification more available, Esquimalt Recreation partnered with Esquimalt High School to allow students to take lifeguard training as part of their normal gym class, offering the program at a reduced cost to participants. This innovative collaboration helped provide a pathway for high school students to become lifeguards and learn valuable skills along the way.
