What is Focus Block?

- Students will attend Focus Block on scheduled Wednesdays from 1:19 pm until 2:05 pm
- This time is for students to self-direct, explore and **FOCUS** on learning
- An opportunity to catch up on work, get some help, or practice skills
- Each student will be assigned a room for Focus Block and attendance taken
- You will work independently, in partners or small groups it just depends!
- Teachers will not be assigning new work
- Focus block <u>does not</u> occur on the second Wednesday of each month that will be an early dismissal day for students at 2:27 pm
- This is instructional time and will not be for clubs, sports or rehearsals during this time

■Parent Connect: How to Check Report Cards online?


