In-School Mentoring is a program offered through Big Brothers Big Sisters that runs throughout the school year on an ongoing basis:






Health and Safety:

ESQ School Nurse

We have Youth Health Clinic at Esquimalt High on Tuesdays 1130-2 in the medical room. Students can access the nurse for general questions during breaks as well as before/after school.

Services provided outlined below:

- Contraception (birth control) dispensing
- Emergency Contraception dispensing (aka morning after pill)
- Referrals for IUDs
- Pregnancy testing (discuss options, referrals etc if needed)
- Sexually transmitted infection testing and treatment
- Urinary tract infection testing and treatment
- Immunizations
- Naloxone administration training and kits available
- Free condoms and lube
- Sexual health questions/educations
- Support following a sexual assault (either support accessing SA resources or can support myself)

WHY SHOULD I ATTEND?

Develop a better understanding of your worldwide neighbourhood... young people who have a desire to make our world a better place will be presented with opportunities in any one of 20 different countries in Europe. Asia and Latin America.

Gain a network of friends that is truly worldwide... the international organization of Rotary brings together students from all corners or our world in the spirit of friendship and understanding.

WHAT'S INVOLVED?

During your time abroad you will be living with one or more host families. The Long Term Exchange program will have you attending high school as well. The Short Term Exchange is a family-to-family exchange, whereby you go out to the other family for 3 to 4 weeks and then return home hosting your host brother/sister here for 3 to 4 weeks. The short term exchange is during the summer holidays, whereas those involved in the long term exchange leave August/September and return the following summer

Host families are carefully screened by Rotary, so that a safe and caring environment is provided.

Selection interviews are held this fall by your local Rotary

WHAT IS YOUTH EXCHANGE

Each year, more than 8,000 young people have the opportunity of a lifetime - a chance to live in another country and see the world from a new perspective through Rotary Youth Exchange. This could be your year!

We offer both short term (6 to 8 weeks) and long term (10-11 months) exchange opportunities.

■Parent Connect: How to Check Report Cards online?




