FREE ONLINE - ERASE Parent Sessions:

(1) MAY 13 - Establishing Safe, Caring, & Respectful Digital Communities -This session covers all things digital, from how to be a good digital citizen, the criminal consequences of cyberbullying, and how to report and receive support in cases of sexting/sextortion. Some of the most prominent concerns currently surrounding use of social media platforms, smartphones, and artificial intelligence will be discussed.



- Step 3: Once you have your Give Blood account (or if you're an existing donor) go to MENU and pick **YOUR team** to register and donate as a group member:

On the menu  click on **Partner** or  and select **+Join Team**

QR = 1min eligibility Quiz

Your group has blocked off the following donation dates, times and locations:

Tuesday 19th May with 20 appts starting from 12.35pm to 1.40pm at Victoria Donor Centre (3449 Saanich Rd)

Check your team exclusive (blocked) appointments in the **GiveBlood** App, under team appointments.

LAST STEP:

From the team schedule (in Give Blood – Partner tab) each donor needs to **select their individual appointment**. Once you've selected your own donation time, you're confirmed and good to go!

Please arrive at your specific donation time (staggered, not all at once) to allow a smooth flow at the front desk. Your entire donation visit will take around **45min**, please plan accordingly.

How to prepare before you donate blood?

- 1) Bring a government ID (health card, driver's license, passport, donor card or Give Blood app)
- 2) Hydrate well (lots of water) before you donate
- 3) Have a meal or salty snack – pls don't donate blood on an empty stomach.

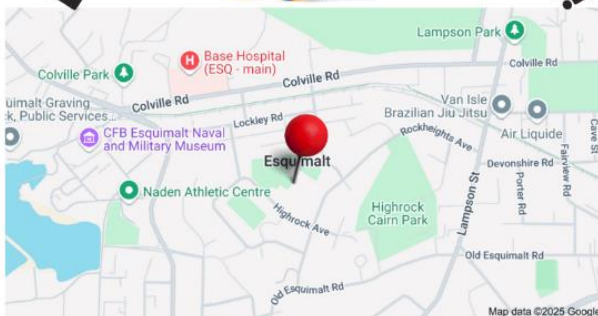

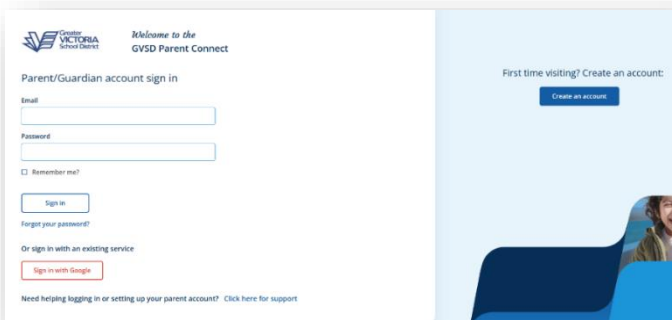

Considering that 20% of the students in SD61 speak different languages than English and French, the service also includes Google Translate to support parents who prefer to communicate in other languages.

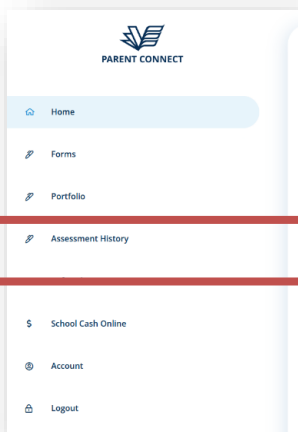

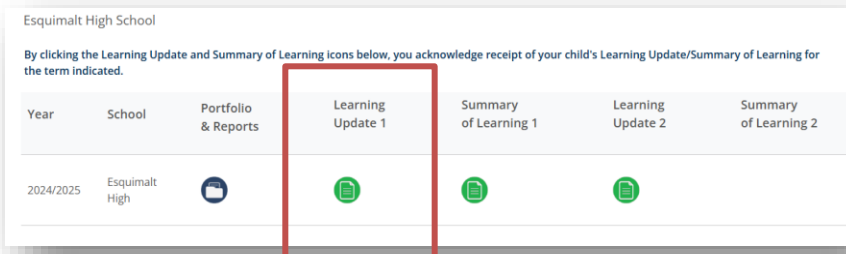
How to access to the Learning updates? Here are the steps

We have Youth Health Clinic at Esquimalt High on Tuesdays 1130-2 in the medical room. Students can access the nurse for general questions during breaks.

Services provided outlined below:

- **Contraception (birth control) dispensing**
- **Emergency Contraception dispensing (aka morning after pill)**
- **Referrals for IUDs**
- **Pregnancy testing (discuss options, referrals etc if needed)**
- **Sexually transmitted infection testing and treatment**
- **Urinary tract infection testing and treatment**
- **Immunizations**
- **Naloxone administration training and kits available**
- **Free condoms and lube**
- **Sexual health questions/educations**
- **Support following a sexual assault (either support accessing SA resources or can support myself)**
